Dear readers,

I've always loved being on a team, and one of the greatest outcomes of owning The Hockey News is that I joined a team of the greatest sports journalists in the world, bar none. But teams come from all corners of life, and winning on the ice, in the newsroom, at work or in life and death circumstances all have traits in common.

Growing up in Montreal during the Canadiens dynasty years, I saw what great teams were made of. Skill, strength, confidence and vision for the path to winning. Dryden, Savard, Richard, Lafleur, Beliveau and many more had the Canadiens' winning team magic. Other teams learned from this winning formula, like the Oilers with the greatest of all-time, Gretzky, surrounded by Kurri, Anderson, Coffey, Messier and others who had that winning team formula down pat.

In the masthead of The Hockey News, you will see the name of Ivy Draper as a Special Advisor to the Publisher. She has held this title and many others (including mom) for my entire life, and she is the leader of my team, which includes The Hockey News.

On Friday, April 26, I was scheduled to go to Transcontinental's RBW printing plant to be there for the first run of our newly designed magazine, Draft Preview, but had to cancel the night before because my mom had fallen and broken her hip.

I left Toronto and arrived at the Ottawa General Hospital in the wee hours of Friday morning when the world seemed asleep and was greeted by a team of nurses and support staff at the hospital. I pulled up a chair and parked myself there for four days and watched the Ottawa General's team of a dozen doctors, residents, nurses, orderlies, porters, therapists, administrative, maintenance and food-service workers care for the captain of my team.

It was a serious situation as major surgery was about to take place in the operating room Sunday evening. As she was in pre-op being readied for surgery, the anesthesiologist, Dr. O'Connor, came over to ask her questions and walk her through the surgery. With a heavy Irish accent, he introduced himself and was the consummate professional. After 10 minutes of this serious monotone voice coming down from this deep Irish accent, he asked mom if she had any questions. Her mouth was dry, and she was having difficulty speaking, but she was able to respond with, "Stupid accent." Dr. O'Connor and the others were stunned with her answer, and it was an awkward moment before Dr. O'Connor asked, "Excuse me"? Mom replied, "Stupid accent," once again. This time Dr. O'Connor looked at me, startled, and I waited for a few seconds to add effect before telling him that her mouth was dry and what she was trying to say was, "stupid accident," as to how she broke her hip. Laughter is not usually heard in the OR pre-op area, but it was on this night, as mom was the one who made everyone laugh.

The team of two surgeons, two anesthesiologists and three nurses, captained by Dr. Pickell, operated for almost two hours, and she was back in her room four hours after the comic relief. I was there right from the early hours of Day 1 up until the time she was being prepared to be repatriated to her local hospital on Monday, and after playing on and watching teams for more than a half-century, I can now say that I have witnessed the greatest team ever. I thought that the Habs or the Oilers were the greatest teams, but now I know better. It's the Ottawa General's team of Thursday, April 25, to Monday, April 29. That is the greatest team of all-time.

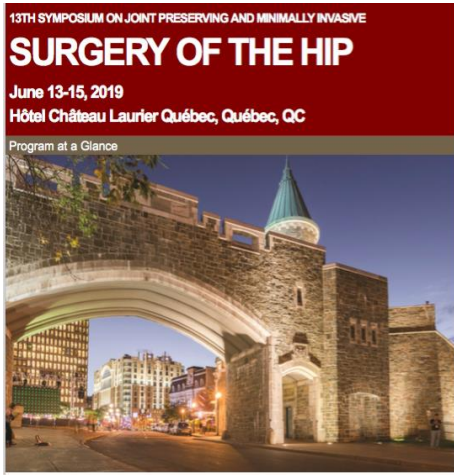

NEW GRANT FOR DRs. ABDELBARy AND MAH

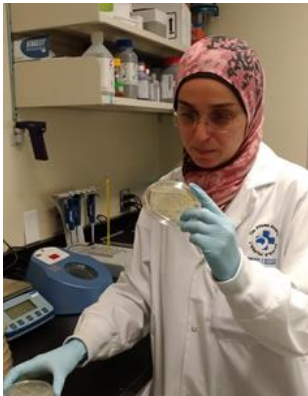


Drs. Hesham Abdelbary and Thien-Fah Mah (BMI) were awarded the Faculty of Medicine of Translational Research Grant in the amount of \$50,000.00. Their project focuses on targeting transcriptional regulator in *Pseudomonas aeruginosa* to control biofilm antibiotic resistance, using *in vivo* biofilm-based PJI rat model.

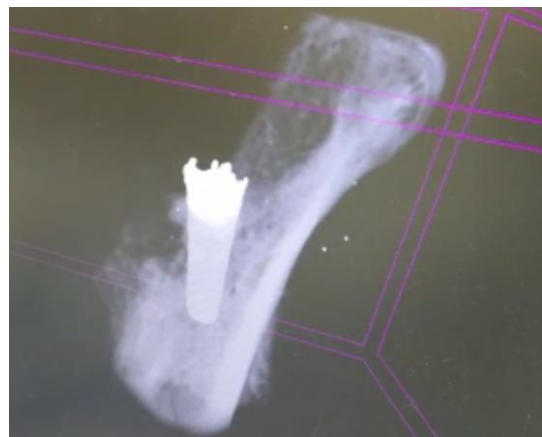
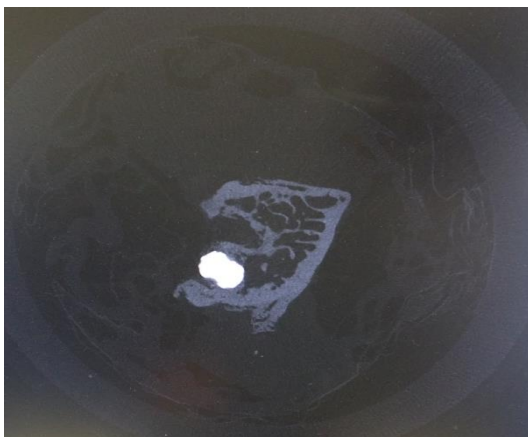

NEW DEVELOPMENT INTO OUR PJI ANIMAL MODEL

Drs. Hesham Abdelbary, Mariam Taha and their team were successfully able to perform hip replacement surgeries in rats using 3D printed titanium implants. Excitingly, micro-CT imaging is providing evidence of osseointegration 9 weeks post-surgery. Moreover, their work is showing the capacity to induce *Staphylococcus aureus* hip infection. This novel model will allow testing novel therapeutic strategies to treat PJI.
